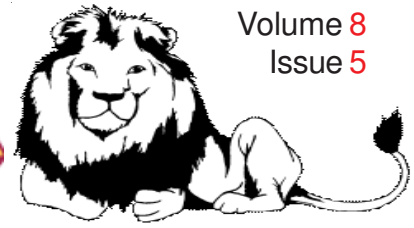

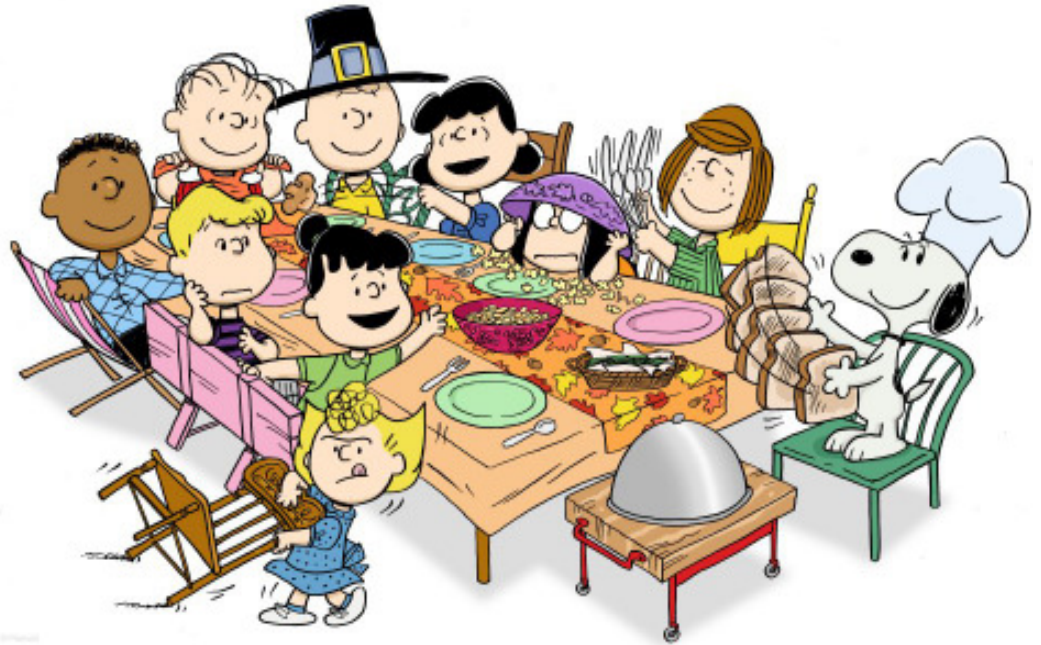

The cost is \$35. The coupons & savings are valid from now through December 30, 2015.

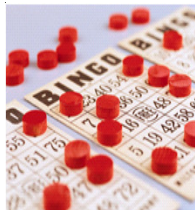

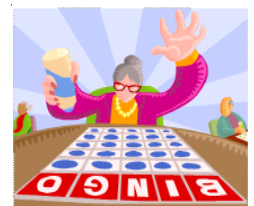
