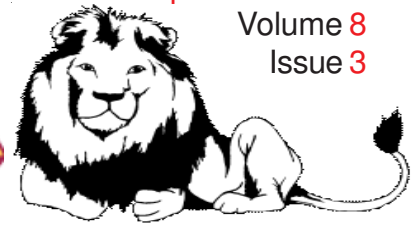

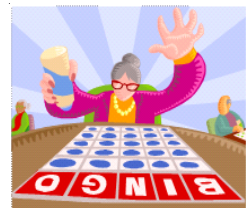
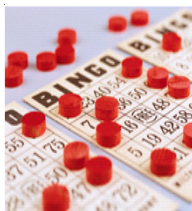

2014 – 2015 Peace Poster Theme: “Peace, Love, & Understanding”

Peace Poster Contest: *Getting Started* (now that you have received your kit)

1. Review the contents of the Peace Poster kit
 - *Getting Started* --- Information For Club Use brochure
 - School or Youth Group Information sheet - includes contest rules & conditions
 - Parent Information sheet - for the teacher to send home with the student
 - Winner's Sticker --- use only on the winning poster submitted to District 11A2
 - Achievement Award Certificate --- for the winning student
 - Certificate of Appreciation --- for participating students
 - Essay Contest Rules --- for students who are visually impaired and unable to participate in the art competition
2. Contact your local school (grades 6, 7, & 8) or youth group. The best time is 1-2 weeks BEFORE school begins. This allows the teacher to incorporate this project into the lesson plans. Speak with the principal, art teacher or youth leader. Explain the contest, emphasizing that it is an “International” contest. Invite them to participate. Be brief! Teachers and principals are very busy.
3. Provide the school or youth group with the “School or Youth Group” information sheet. Point out the Contest Rules & Conditions such as the theme, the eligible age group (students age 11, 12, or 13 years of age on Nov. 15, 2014), and the strict artwork size guidelines (no smaller than 13 by 20 inches and no larger than 20 by 24 inches).
4. Collect the completed artwork by mid-October. Arrange to have your Lions club members pick the winning artwork to send to District 11A2. Have the student and the student's parent complete and sign the winner sticker. Apply completed sticker (must be the original, no copies) to the back of the artwork (bottom right),
5. All winning posters must be delivered to the District Governor by November 1, 2014.
6. Invite teachers, students, and parents to a club meeting to receive their awards. Give the school an award plaque to thank them for participating.
7. Publicize the club contest winner.
8. Judging to determine the District winning poster will take place at the 3 region meetings in November.
9. District winning poster then proceeds to judging at the multi-district/state level. The state winner then proceeds to the International judging held at Lions Clubs International Headquarters.
