





Leader Dogs for the Blind is Accepting Applications for their 2016 Summer Experience Camp

Do you know any teenagers who could use a week of fun, outdoor activity and friendship this summer? Do you think they would enjoy kayaking, rock wall climbing and tandem biking? How about the challenge of developing new travel skills and stretching their independence? If so, the Leader Dogs for the Blind Summer Experience Camp was designed with them in mind.

The program combines outdoor activities with things exclusively Leader Dog—GPS training and the opportunity to spend time with Leader Dogs in training and guide dog mobility instructors. The combination will help them increase the skills they need to live independently!

Summer Experience Camp is for boys and girls ages 16 and 17 who are legally blind. The program is completely free including airfare to Michigan—and everyone receives a free HumanWare Trekker Breeze+ GPS device to keep. Summer Experience Camp is scheduled for June 25—July 2, 2016. Applications are due by April 1, 2016. MD 11 Centennial and PR Committees Join Forces on State-Wide Billboard Campaign

A state-wide Centennial PR campaign is in the planning stages as the two committees have gained approval from the Council to apply for a \$15,000 LCI grant. If approved, the funds, along with additional funds from each district, will be used for a concentrated billboard media buy.

The Council of Governors has voted unanimously to support this project and to request a minimum of \$100 per club from each district in Michigan's MD 11. Any club that contributes \$200 or more will receive a special banner patch commemorating their exceptional commitment to this project. Per Lions of Michigan State Treasurer Paul Hemeryck, funds may be drawn from *either* the clubs' Activities fund or from the Administrative account.

The largest billboards will be placed on major freeways, while smaller "community billboards" will be utilized along major roads. Posters will also be available for placement in local churches, businesses, libraries, etc.... Each of the posters will have a space for specific club contact information, while the billboards will feature a website address as well as social media icons. The design will be based on the International Centennial logo but will be customized for the state of Michigan.

The objectives of this project are:

- Increase Awareness of Lions International and our Centennial Celebration
- Increase Donations to MI Lions Clubs
- Increase Membership in MI Lions Clubs
- Publicize MI Lions as a resource for those who need our services

We are required to provide minimum matching funds of 20%. In order to conduct the extensive campaign we envision, we need to significantly exceed this match. The more funds we have to work with, the more areas we can cover, so please, start talking to your clubs about your contribution to this project.

By working together, we can have a huge impact with a relatively minimal expense to each club. Checks can be made payable to "Lions of Michigan" and put "Centennial PR Project" on the memo line. Please send all monies directly to the State Office at 5730 Executive Drive, Lansing, MI 48911. Thank you in advance for your contributions; we can't wait to get started!

Someone from the Lions Club will contact you to arrange delivery or pickup of your Lion to be decorated for the event. After the event you can take the Lion Home to bring back to the 2017 event and save \$50 off your Registration Fee.

General Information: Sponsors decorate the large wooden Lions to represent their business or organization. Awards will be given out for the Best Dressed/Most Creative Lion as voted on by the attendees. Door prizes awarded during the event. 50/50 Drawings between races with only 100 tickets being sold for each 50/50 Raffle.

Lion Racing Format: The number of heats will be based on the number of Lions Adopted with six Lion in each Heat. Lions will be placed in the starting blocks and identified with a number representing the lane they are in. Two large dice will be thrown and the Lions with the number on the top of the thrown dice will move up one spot. If the two dice come up with the same number that Lion will move up two spaces. First Lion to reach the number TEN is declared the winner of the heat. If two Lions tie then they will both be returned to the number nine spot and the dice will be thrown again (all other Lions will be removed from the table at that time).

Betting Process: Betting slips will be identified by lane and race number (written at the time of bet) on pre-numbered slips. All betting slips will cost \$1 with a different color betting slip per race and the odds of winning are based on upon the dollars bet and will be announced prior to the start of the race. All bets and pay outs during the races will be by "Lion Money". Lion money will be available to purchase upon entering the event and during the races. Lion Money will be turned in after the event and paid out at face value in cash.


