




Dear Fellow Lions Members:

For those of you that don't know the story (and many of you do) of my son's medical journey these last sixteen months I would like to take a moment and share a brief version of it with you. On January 4, 2016 my son, Joey, was diagnosed with Viral Dilated Cardio Myopathy. A virus attacked the left ventricle of his heart. After a week in one hospital he was transferred on January 13th to Henry Ford Hospital in downtown Detroit and put on life support. He was put in a drug induced coma that day and kept there for the next four weeks while the amazing team of doctors worked on saving his life. On January 20th, he had a LVAD (Left ventricle assist device) implanted. It is a mechanical heart. Also I forgot to mention that when he was put on life support they also informed us that his kidney and liver had shut down. Mine and my wife's life came to a complete stand still. You see nothing prepares you for something like this.

After Twenty-two IV's, seven machines, kidney dialysis, four weeks in a coma, three open heart surgeries, 25 days of in hospital rehabilitation so he could learn to walk and 118 days total- Joey was finally able to come home! Due to the extended time lying in bed he had damage to some nerves which lead to no feeling in his right leg from the knee down and he also has foot drop in both feet. He came home in a wheel chair. He worked his butt off in rehab determined to get out of the wheel chair and the walker. Come hell or high water he was going back to school in the fall at U of M. With heart pump and all he went back last fall and he is doing great. He still doesn't have any feeling in the right leg and still has foot drop in both legs but he is headed in the right direction. At some point he will be listed on the heart transplant list. We just don't know when.

So why am I sharing our personal family story with you? I am so thankful to have my company, Raymond James supporting my efforts in promoting awareness around heart disease and stroke through their participation and fundraising efforts. I am graciously asking you to please consider supporting my fundraising efforts as well. The American Heart Association will be holding its's 24th annual event on Saturday, May 20th on the grounds of Wayne State University and I would love for Raymond James to be there in full force to show our support in the fight against heart disease and stroke! Joey has been asked to be the speaker at this event to share his story. Can I please count on your support through one of the following? 1. PDG Bob Wylin of Armada has been diagnosed with End-Stage Kidney Disease. He is looking for a type O Positive kidney donor. He has been approved as a candidate for kidney replacement through Beaumont Hospital. However, the wait for a kidney can be from 3 to 5 years.

Bob has had a 70# weight loss during the last 3 years, and his failing 71 year-old body cannot afford the wait. We are asking for prayers in our search for a donor. Bob has a long and active history in Lionism, with nearly 40 years of service. Please keep Bob in your thoughts and prayers and do what you can to spread the word about his search for a kidney donor.

Social media has proven to be a very effective way to reach thousands of people. Please be sure to mention Bob in a post to your friends and family. Recently in northern Michigan, a donor and a recipient were united through Facebook and a successful transplant took place at U of M hospital in Ann Arbor.
