# Lions Clubs International Lion Scott Edward Berry First Vice District Governor

On Wednesday, October 17, 2018, I attended the Martha T. Berry Foundation 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Awards Dinner at Zuccaro's Banquet Hall in Chesterfield, MI. The Martha T. Berry MCF Foundation donates proceeds from this community event to fund projects and improvements at Martha T. Berry MCF and to provide needed essentials for quality of life for residents who cannot financially provide for themselves.

Martha T. Berry Medical Care facility was opened in 1950, largely through the generosity of the late Henry G. Berry, M.D., who practiced medicine in Macomb County for approximately 50 years. The building was named in memory of Dr. Berry's wife, Martha Taylor Berry. Currently the building is governed by the County Board of Commissioners and overseen by an appointed Board of Social Services. The Martha T. Berry Foundation plays a very important role in ensuring the highest quality of life for the residents of Martha T. Berry. The Foundation provides residents with opportunities for enjoyable and enriching experiences.

So let me tell you what happened that night. David Peters, President of A.H. Peters Funeral Homes, paid for several of his workers to attend the awards dinner. As I stood and waited for the event to begin, I noticed on the other side of the hall a beautiful lady sitting by herself. So I left my fellow colleagues and their spouses to go talk to her. Her name is Beeswan. She was the wife of the event's photographer and she knew no one. She was 82 years old and her husband was 69. We talked for 10 minutes and then the dinner began, and I left. After the conclusion of the dinner, I noticed she was by herself again. I walked back over. We talked for just over 45 minutes and I walked out with her and her husband. In that 45 minutes she told me she was born in the country side of Georgia, the youngest one of nine children, met her first husband and then moved to Michigan for an automotive job, and raised several children of her own. Her first husband died from cancer and two months later met her current husband who had lost his wife the month earlier. We talked about everything that night, I made a new friend and why did I do this?

## 2018-2019 DISTRICT 11-A2 LIONS CLUBS DIABETES AWARENESS & EDUCATION GRANT "WE SERVE"

#### **DIABETES FACTS**

- 422 Million People World-Wide Have Diabetes and 50% may not know they have it
- Since 1988, the number of adults with Diabetes Quadrupled
- The US population is 325 million; 38.3 million (11%) have diabetes and 27.8% are undiagnosed
- 10% of Michigan's 9.95 million populations have diabetes
- 26% of Michigan's population lives in Macomb, and Oakland Counties, where socio-economic factors attribute to higher diabetes numbers

Diabetes is at epidemic proportions World-Wide. Lions Clubs International Foundation has selected DIABETES AWARENESS AND EDUCATION as a priority initiative. Lions International has offered matching FUND Diabetes Grants this year. Lions Clubs of Michigan have applied for \$250,000 Grant from LCIF for 2018 which was submitted on October 1, 2018. LCIF will provide matching funds of \$187,500 for MD-11 and SD-10 with the eleven Districts to provide \$62,500. District 11-A2 needs to raise \$5,681 and we will receive \$17,045 for a total of \$22,726 to use for the following initiatives.

- ✓ Screenings with comprehensive care
- ✓ Camps, Symposiums and Retreats
- ✓ Infrastructure and equipment acquisition
- ✓ Human resource and capacity building

If each Lions Club would contribute \$150 in District 11-A2 by the end of December, 2018 we will have our matching funds of \$5,681 to receive the LCIF funds of \$17,045 to complete the above described initiatives over the next 12 months in our communities. 

Check LCIF website to learn more about other sight programs. Lions of Michigan have been doing eye screenings thru the "Kidsight" program in each District.

Michigan received Vision Screening grant in 2016 for \$48,688 and another in 2018 for \$47,000. Eversight of Michigan recently received a matching Standard Grant

from LCIF to update some of their equipment which was submitted by District 11A2.

#### **LCIF Awards Disaster Grants**

For districts impacted by a natural disaster including tornadoes, hurricanes, floods, and tsunamis, Emergency Grants provide up to US\$10,000. Lions district governors may apply for disaster relief funds to help meet immediate needs such as food, water, clothing and medical supplies. District 11E1 applied for an Emergency Grant to help with the August 28, 2018 Tornado relief.

#### **Fighting Measles Epidemic**

With support from LCIF and the Gavi Matching Fund, 49.5 million children have been immunized in communities across the world. For the first time in known history, the annual measles death rate has declined to less than 100,000 deaths per year. LCIF applauds this achievement and is proud to have contributed to this success.

#### November is "Diabetes Awareness Month"

During the month of November, Lions all over are coming together in the fight against diabetes. According to the <u>International Diabetes Federation</u>, an estimated 400 million people are living with diabetes and this number is expected to rise to 592 million by 2035. It is important for Lions to <u>raise awareness</u> for this deadly and debilitating disease. **State of Michigan was recently awarded a grant from LCIF for "Defense Against Diabetes" (D.A.D.).** Each District will be making a financial commitment towards this grant which will help Michigan Lions with diabetes screening, prevention, treatment and education. Contact your District Diabetes Coordinator for more information about this great opportunity.

<u>Working together</u>, we can use the LCIF resources such as grants to help us work locally on many of our Lionistic projects. The grants help us with funding to successfully accomplish Lion events where we provide service to those in need. **This year LCIF has offered a new "District & Club Community Impact" grant.** This grant allows the Lion's project to address an important humanitarian need and provide an opportunity to highlight Lions Clubs in the communities they serve. 


