Next was the MD 11 Convention. We started with a picnic at Leader Dog. After the picnic dinner, GST Justin Faber had all of us do a service project. We worked with "Wigs 4 Kids" making up bracelets, necklaces, and makeup mirrors for kids. This program provides wigs and support services to children experiencing hair loss as a result of illness and treatment. We went to both of our District DAD programs at Leader Dog. They were very informative and well put together programs featuring excellent speakers; even our RC Tammie was a speaker on fitness. Thanks to Lion Roger Blackwell and Lion Bob Erickson for setting this up. Great job!

I encourage all clubs to set one of these programs up in their community. This is what we want to provide to promote the awareness of diabetes. Don't worry about the cost—we need to burn through \$22k this year! If we don't use it, we lose it!



This past month, I had the pleasure of presenting an In-House Scholarship to one of the graduates from the Eastpointe High School, formerly the East Detroit High School on behalf of the Eastpointe Lions Club. Our recipient was Elijah Cram and he is one of the Valedictorians. (Any student with a GPA of 4.0 or higher is a Valedictorian.) Elijah is a very smart man that plans to go to Eastern Michigan University. All the members of the Eastpointe Lions Club wish him the very best with his future endeavors.

While I was attending the scholarship presentation, I had a discussion with one of the teachers from the Eastpointe High School. He stated that more of the students from the graduating class would have received a scholarship, but the student never completed the form. Many of the students did not want to take the time to complete approximately five pages of questions regarding school activities, service to the community, family information, obtain two referrals from non-family members, and write two essays.

This sounded familiar to me since Lions do the same thing with service grants. Both Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation has several grants available for Lions and grants are there to support our efforts in services programs and for training of our future leaders. Many grants are designed to support multiple clubs working on one project or projects at a district or multiple district level. Do not discount the possibility of using them in the future.

Grants from Lions Clubs International (LCI) are called Association Grants and are composed of Women and Family Grants, Membership Development Grants, Public Relations Grants, Leadership Development Grants, and Leadership Development Institute Grant Programs. Grants from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) are called Foundation Grants and include SightFirst Grants, Matching Grants, Diabetes Grants, Disaster Grants, Lions Quest Grants, Designated Grants, Leo Grants, District/Club Community Grants, and Humanitarian Award Winners.

Remember, District 11-A2 has funds available to be requested from LCIF for the District Community Grant. Once the funds become available, they can be used at any time for up to 10 years, then they are forfeited. We still have nine more years to go.






