HELP ME, PLEASE.

I am still looking for zone chairs for some of the zones. The responsibilities of a zone chair are very simple but will require some time. Each zone chair person is asked to attend the Lions meetings of the other clubs in their zone twice a year. You will be asked to attend the cabinet meetings hosted by the region chair persons and the district governor elect. You will also be asked to attend the region meetings of your region and host one region meeting through out the year. When visiting clubs, you will be asked to discuss programs relating to Lions Clubs International and their foundation; specifically LCI's intent to use the MyLion (and My Lion for web) for reporting club's service activities, district community grants, etc. It's easy but takes some time.

Lions Clubs International's website has an area called the "Service Launchpad". It is an interactive tool lions and leos can use to help start planning for a service project. Answer a series of questions and a premade service template is produced. The template is fully customizable. It is intended to help with planning of the service project. Try it out for your diabetes service project.

As of March 1, 2019 3/4 of our Lion year is over already. Where did the time go??

During the last week of February, I went to the Lions of Michigan Forum in Flint. Training sessions for incoming governors were held there and I was struck by the thought that just when you think you know a little you find out you really know very little! The classes are designed to help all of the Governors learn more about the Lions and also about how to help their District their individual clubs grow stronger.

There were four breakout sessions held on Saturday, and each of those had four course selections. Lions from any club in the state could learn a lot from any one of these sessions; from Defense Against Diabetes (D.A.D), to large- and small group service projects, to being an effective tail twister.

February was **not** a good month for 11- A2 Membership! At the start of the year the District had 1372 members. Since July 1st. 50 new members were added, five were reinstated and two transferred in. This gave the District a total of 1422 members before adjusting for non-retention. It is certainly sad enough that we have to deduct a number of members lost due to death and re-location, but of more concern is the fact that 41 members have been dropped from clubs so far this year as "Resigned in Good Standing" or for non-attendance/non-payment of dues. If the District could have kept just half of those 41 members, then we would be at **+ 1** for the year. While fifty new members for the first 8 months is very good for the District, losing 41 resigning in good standing for **Personal Reasons** is not good for the District. We need to look at **Retention** in our clubs.

I look forward to seeing everyone at the April District Convention in Bay City.

LEADER DOG NEWS FOR LIONS – 2019

NEW TRAINING OPTIONS



Urban training in Chicago and Deaf-Blind training in Naples, Florida are part of Leader Dog's options for clients.

Beginning in July 2019, Leader Dogs for the Blind will offer a variety of Guide Dog Training options:

On-campus: This option mirrors our current training design but will be three weeks in length. Clients are able to focus on training without everyday distractions of home, e.g., cooking, cleaning, family.

In-home Delivery: A guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) takes a dog to the client and trains the team in the home environment for up to 10 days. This format benefits clients who need to care for a family member or continue a full-time job. In-home delivery is designed for experienced clients but can be an option for first-time guide dog users.

Flex: Training starts on campus and then transitions to the client's home. This allows the client to solidify the basics of guide dog work before transferring the skills to their normal environment with GDMI support.

Urban: An option for clients who live, work or travel in large cities. The training consists of two weeks of on-campus training followed by one week in Chicago.

Warm Weather: This 14-day class is held in Naples, Florida and is offered to clients who live in warm environments or have health conditions that do not allow them to be outdoors in cold climates.

Deaf-Blind: Training specifically for clients with both hearing and vision loss. Clients may be hearing impaired or profoundly deaf. Deaf-Blind clients may attend warm weather training in Florida to allow for better communication when utilizing Tactile American Sign Language.

Please remember and follow these guidelines:

- ALL Convention attendees **MUST** be registered.
- Reservations & cancellations **MUST** be made with **BOTH** the hotel and the convention committee.
- Meal tickets must be purchased in advance; none will be sold at convention.
