This has been a month that I will never forget and that many of you will remember. The district convention would be over and 1VDG Leo Schaefer would have to change his title to District Governor Elect, but not so fast. Even though the district convention has been cancelled, elections will be conducted on Sunday, April 26, 2020. The exact details are still being worked out and will be dependent on the current requirements set out by law enforcement and Governor Whitmer.

What can you do?

First, please stay safe and healthy.

Secondly, Lions Clubs International Foundation has emergency grants available up to \$10,000 the district could apply for. We need you to be diligent and look for ways to apply a potential emergency grant to our district or combine with District 11-A1 also. Some criteria apply for the grant to be approved.

- Have at least 100+ people infected (confirmed cases) in the immediate area/district.
- Keep to a US\$10,000 maximum request amount
- Funds available only to address active and immediate cases; not future outbreaks.
- Funds should be used for Lions to work with local medical and emergency management services that are addressing the outbreak. This could be for







- sourcing medical supplies, quarantine-related expenses, etc. (i.e. transportation, food) for those infected.
- Funds may not cover personal expenses for those infected or quarantined (i.e. personal bills, medical insurance, lost wages, etc.).

Thirdly, look for ways Lions can serve our community in the post COVID-19 era. This could be right now or being prepared for the next one.

The cabinet meeting to be held in April 2020 will now be held at a later date, hopefully in May 2020. We may meet in person or use a teleconference software to hold the meeting. The meeting will be hosted by 1VDG Leo Schaefer and the Armada Lions Club.

The Multiple District 11 Convention has been cancelled for 2020 along with the International Convention. To stay on top of all the changes and cancellations, please subscribe to Past Council Chair Frank Cunningham's email list. You can join his list by sending an email to frank.cunningham723@gmail.com and ask to be added. Please make sure to check your junk mail if you're not receiving the emails.

Remember to submit your PU101 to the District Governor, First Vice District Governor, and Cabinet Secretary. You can also enter this information online through MyLCI. If you need help contact District Administrator Tracy Antrikin, she is here to help.

I hope everyone is practicing social distancing. But if you are not, especially with your spouse or significant other, and evidence is produced in nine months from this behavior, here are a few names you could use. Stay positive and stay safe.



The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

On March 20, I advised you that our 2020 convention would not be held in Singapore due to the limitations put in place by the Singapore Ministry of Health. After evaluating a variety of different options, including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors decided in favor of canceling the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 has an impact on international officers. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is

- **Executive Officers:** Since no convention is held and no successors are elected, the executive officers' terms will continue until declaration of the election of his or her successor at the next International Convention.
- International Directors: As international director terms allow for both two years of service in the role, and for successors to be elected, if no convention is held and no successors are elected, the international directors' terms will continue until the declaration of the election of his or her successor at the next International Convention.
- Director from Africa and ANZI areas: A director from Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in even-numbered years. As a result, no director from Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.
- **District Governors:** District governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors are elected during a convention of their respective districts. Barring any election complaints, the International Board of Directors intend to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

Lions of Michigan Sight and Hearing Sweepstakes

Due to the cancellation of the Multiple District 11 Convention, there have been a lot of questions regarding the status of the Sight and Hearing Sweepstakes drawings scheduled for May 2 and May 16. The drawings will be held as scheduled with the May 2 drawing being held at the Lions of Michigan State Office and the May 16 drawing being held at either the Doubletree by Hilton in Holland or at the Lions of Michigan State Office, if approved by the Michigan Lottery Bureau. Note, if there is a change for the May 16 drawing, a notification will be sent out at that time.

With everything in Michigan closing down, we realize that March and April ticket sales will be challenging. However, we ask that Lions and Lioness Clubs do whatever they can to continue selling tickets as our fixed costs are already locked in. Lions Headquarters Remain Closed

PIP Frank Moore The Illinois State government in the USA announced that its stay-at-home order will be extended until at least April 30 to slow the spread of the coronavirus. The measures included the requirement to cease all nonessential services in the state. Lions Clubs International is identified as "nonessential." To comply with the state mandate, the Lions Clubs International Headquarters in Oak Brook will be closed at least until April 30, 2020.

While staff will not physically be in the building, staff teams will be working remotely and available during business hours to respond to the needs of Lions. You may <u>contact LCI</u> <u>staff</u> or <u>LCIF staff</u> as needed.

The performance of systems may be impacted due to the increased number of people working remotely, and response time may be affected. Some of our business operations that require physical interaction will likely be limited.

More details will be provided as the situation evolves, but here is some preliminary guidance:

- Regarding payment of outstanding dues, we recommend that districts allow clubs that are able
 to demonstrate they have sent or submitted payment to participate in voting. This could be via a
 bank statement, copy of demand draft, etc. Clubs will not be cancelled during this time based on
 the challenges related to receiving and processing physical checks and electronic payments.
- For Lions International payments, please utilize online payment options via MyLCI or any other electronic payment method (ACH, SEPA, Boleto, NEFT, etc.) instead of sending checks to the office.

Please <u>submit LCIF donations</u> via the website instead of sending checks to the office. Please also note that grant disbursements and recognition will be delayed while the office is closed.

• There will be delays in shipping awards and recognitions, club supplies orders, as well as delays in processing reimbursements.

We appreciate your patience during these extraordinary times and wish for the health and safety of all our Lions and staff around the world.




The Macombers
