

#### HOW TO MEET DURING THE PANDEMIC

Need to host a Zoom Call for a meeting or event? The District 11-A2 Information Technology (IT) Committee can help. This past year has been challenging for our District officers to hold effective meetings with the COVID-19 crisis restricting how we can meet and the length of time.

In order to assist the District and clubs in District 11-A2, the 2020-2021 District 11-A2 Cabinet has purchased a Zoom-Pro account that can be used to schedule meetings. This account will allow meetings of up to 100 people to attend and will not have any time limit (only the limit you select as the host).

The use of this Zoom-Pro Account will be coordinated by the District 11-A2 IT Committee for scheduling.

The order of priority for reserving a meeting time is as follows:

- Cabinet Meetings
- Region Meetings
- District Committee Meetings
- Club Board Meetings
- Club Meetings

So, for instance, if a Lions Club requests a meeting date/time, and then the District IT Committee would like to meet on that same date/time, then the Lions Club meeting would get bumped. They would be contacted by the committee to reschedule.

A list of the Schedule Meetings(Name of meeting, Date, Time) will be included in the email that PCC Frank Cunningham sends out with the District Calendar of Events. This may not have the most current information as the Zoom Account will contain the Master Calendar and it will be consulted before any meeting is scheduled.

The committee member will check the Master Calendar in Zoom, generate your Meeting Invitation and email it to the requestor and email PCC Frank Cunningham to add your meeting to the document that he will publish with the list of scheduled meetings. You, as the requestor, will then email your attendees the invitation which will have the link to your meeting or the dial in information. Here is an example:
