1st Vice District Governor's Notes

I am still in need of Lions to fill the roles of Zone and Region Chairs on next year's cabinet and committee assignments. But that really isn't as important to me today so it can wait until next month.

As I am sure you are all aware by now, the world of Lions
Clubs International lost a great Lion with the passing of
"Big" Al Kassin. Outside of family members, Al was one of
the people I have known for the longest in my life. I met Al



when my dad and I were in downtown Lake Orion working on the Bicentennial celebration that the Lions were working on in 1976. Al was a lot like the other Lions back then; they tolerated having "Leach's kid" around being a pain in the ass. But Al was different, much different, and I was about to find out firsthand just how different he really was.

He called my dad one day and told him to bring me to Camp Franklin where Al worked as Camp Manager. When we got there, Al told my dad to go ahead and go back to work as he'd show me around camp; which he did, for the next month that summer! Al realized that we did not have a lot growing up and so he allowed me to come to camp and be part of the summer camp experience that all the kids from Detroit were having.

I found out at an early age that the nickname "Big Al" had more to do with the size of his heart. When Al began planning to have the very first Lake Orion Lions Visually Impaired Youth Camp, he called my dad again and asked him to bring me and meet him at a local restaurant because he wanted to talk. I was excited and I thought that maybe I was going to get to go back to camp as it had been 5 years since I last attended. It was kinda, but not really! Al told me about his idea to have a one-week camp for visually impaired kids the following summer. He asked me if I would like to work in the kitchen. What I wanted to say was I'd like to come to camp and play again, but the look on my dad's face said that I shouldn't say no, or it would definitely be a long walk home. So, I said yes, and besides asking Kim to marry me, this was the smartest, and easiest thing I ever did! I won't go into the long details of Al's & my history with camp as most of that has already been told. There are other things that I need to share with you about Al.

During the 1992 camp session, Al and my Grandpa Sam were sitting outside talking. As I walked up to

them I could tell that they were in an intense conversation. It was right before lunch, so I thought maybe they were debating camp food (which my grandpa always said tasted like dirt, did not matter what it was, it was dirt.) or something else particularly important to the day. I was a little hesitant to approach them, but they were right by the door to the dining hall, so I had to. Al told me to sit down with them which, of course, I did. I learned real early on if Al told you something, you listened, and you did it.

Al asked me if I had considered being a Lion. I said that I had but that I didn't think I was ready because no one had ever asked me. Al said well, I am asking you right now. I was totally caught off guard. My dad had me come to all of their projects and work them, but had never asked me to join so I figured that I was not ready. I sat down, looked at my grandpa and asked him what he thought. He told me that he thought I was more than ready, but that I should wait for my dad to ask me to join. Al did not like that answer and used language that it was a good thing no campers were around to hear. Al asked my grandpa who had sponsored my dad into the club. Grandpa Sam said that he did to which Al said, "Then it makes even more sense for you to sponsor Jimmy"! He told my grandpa that either he would sponsor me, or Al was going to. My grandpa, knowing that he had better do it, did sponsor me but it was Al who installed me!

Al saw something in me long ago and I think that is why he has always been and continues to be one of my mentors in Lions and in life. When I was asked in 2012 to run for Governor, Al was one of the first people I talked to about it. I wanted to see if he thought I was ready; he did and he was excited that I was getting the opportunity. When I was asked to run for a second time, I talked to Al again. He was excited for me because he knew I could do it but was disappointed that the situation came about. He told me that he would be there to support me and stand behind any decision that I made.

I could write for a long time about Al and what he means to me, but I think you understand where this is all coming from. Al has been, and will always be, like a second father to me. I can't really remember a time in my life when he wasn't a part of it. Yes, on Lake Orion's March Membership report, it will show that we lost a member who passed away. But the world of Lions, and the world in general, lost much more than that. It is going to take a lot of big feet to fill the small shoes of "Big Al" Kassin.



LIONS CLUBS OF MICHIGAN DEFENSE AGAINST DIABETES PROGRAM D.A.D.

The Defense Against Diabetes (D.A.D.) program is an eight-week lifestyle change program developed from the CDC's year-long National Diabetes Prevention Program (NDPP) curriculum. The National Kidney Foundation of Michigan (NKFM) has selected key elements of the NDPP and made them deliverable in eight, one-hour distance learning sessions. Sessions will be facilitated via the Zoom platform by a trained and certified DPP Lifestyle Coach with experience providing the CDC's program.

NKFM's Lifestyle Coaches will work with Lions Club members to develop healthier eating habits and introduce physical activity into their weekly routines. Each participant will be provided the tools and support necessary to succeed at the program. Lifestyle Coaches will be available to participants anytime throughout the program via phone, text, and email.

- **Elections** Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
