Clem Nowak, age 94, a founding member of Beverly Hills Lions Club passed away April 11, 2021.

Clemens J. Nowak, Sr. husband, father, grandfather, veteran and Charter Member of the Beverly Hills Lions Club, Melvin Jones recipient with 45 years of service supporting club fund raising activities and events as our honoree. Along with being the Club President he served as secretary for eleven years and championed our 501(c) 3 designation.

Clem worked on the 1st Beverly Hills Lions Memorial Day Fun Run 28 years ago. Clem organized and cochaired "Beverly Hills Bluegrass Concert Series", consisting of six yearly concerts held at Groves High School Little Theatre. 
