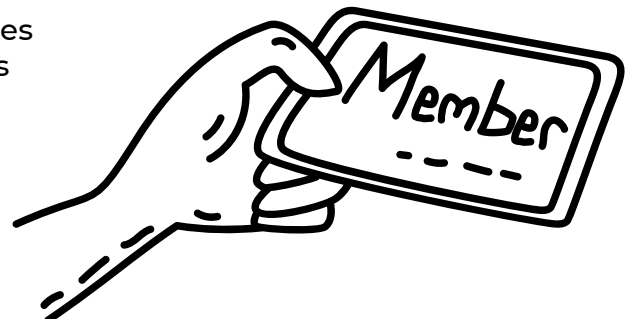

PURPOSE: To recognize a District 11 A2 Lion for sustained, outstanding commitment and dedicated service as a Lion to the Community and District.

CRITERIA:

- Service must include club & district level participation. MD & LCI level participation is NOT a requirement although can be a plus. (NOTE: This is intended as a District award for service at the District & Club level in this District.)
- Must have served in a leadership role at the Club and District level.
- Demonstrated service in support of one or more of the established District projects & programs.
- Demonstrated service directly involving voluntary service to the Community.
- Must currently be a District 11 A2 Lion in good standing as a full member with a minimum of seven years membership in the District at the time of the District Convention where this award is to be presented.
- Nominee may NOT have been previous recipient of the Harold Pocklington Service Award. Nominee may NOT be currently serving as an International Director, District Governor or as a Vice District Governor.

Nominations must be submitted in writing to the Immediate Past District Governor not later than February 1, 2023 in proper format to:

SELECTION PROCESS:

- The Honorary Committee, chaired by the IPDG, shall consist of those PDG's who are active members of a District 11A2 Lions Club. The District Governor shall be a part of voting process but may not make a nomination.
- Only one nomination by each member of the Honorary Committee, consisting of Past District Governors, may be submitted during a Lion's year.
- Nominations shall be submitted, in writing, or by email to the most recent IPDG. Following the selection, the IPDG shall be responsible to obtain the plaque and medallion. IPDG will also be responsible for having them engraved and shall present the award at the Annual District Convention Banquet. If the current IPDG is unable to do the presentation the next previous IPDG will do the presentation.
- Information collected along with the medallions and engraving for plaques shall be shared with the next IPDG following the presentation of the Distinguished Service Award and the last meeting of the Honorary committee.

In order to secure complete nomination information, a PDG may need to contact the person being nominated. This information should remain confidential within the Honorary Committee.

In the event that a PDG is nominated for the Distinguished Service Award, the Chairperson of the Honorary Committee (or other designated chair if the IPDG is a nominee), upon receipt of the completed nomination form, shall notify the nominated PDG. Thereafter, the nominated PDG shall not participate in the selection process during the Lion's year of the nomination.

VOTING PROCESS:

- IPDG will call for a meeting of the Honorary Committee (consisting of active PDG's who have served for District 11A2) no less than 30 days prior to Annual District Convention. A quorum of the selection committee shall be no less than one third of the eligible members. If there is not a quorum or if no candidate receives the stated amount of votes, the award shall not be given in that year.
- Voting shall be by written ballot or via telephone conference call (if necessary). The recipient must receive one more than 50% of the ballots cast. If no nominee receives 1 more than 50% of the ballots cast, then the committee will take the top two (2) nominations and revote. Winner will be determined by who receives 50% plus one vote.
- No proxy votes will be allowed and a Past Pocklington Award recipient will count the votes as directed by the IPDG.
- The Honorary Committee will be asked to keep the winning nomination a secret until Annual District Convention.

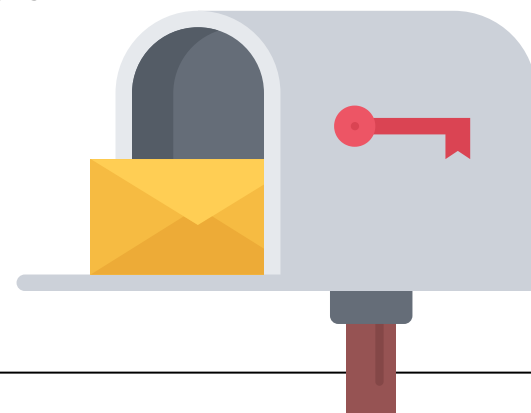

Local Lions Combine Forces to Stamp Out Hunger

Beverly Hills Lions Club member David Stein coordinated this Outreach Program for St. Stephen's Episcopal Church to involve the local community in packaging meals to be sent to the impoverished around the world. The Rochester Hills Lions heard about the project from one of our members, Lion Richard Kenefic, who attends St. Stephen's and Lion Bob Westbury attends St. Stephen's.

The meal packaging event was a fun, educational, high-energy, turn-key way to engage everyone in our community in hands-on service. Rise Against Hunger brings all of the equipment, ingredients, and organizational staffing to host an impactful, easy service project!

Community Service Organizations Collaborate

Since Lions Clubs International first began in 1917, we have always had the We Serve mindset. As the largest service club organization in the world, with over 1.4 million members; Lions Clubs strengthen local communities to improve health and well-being, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services, particularly in the area of low-vision.

Rotary's mission is to provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders. Founded in Detroit in 1915, Kiwanis is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to improving the world, one child, and one community at a time, providing services from adult, college, high school, and elementary school level clubs. The Rochester Hills Public Library serves people living or working in Rochester, Rochester Hills, and Oakland Township. Each organization focuses on slightly different tasks; however, community service is the common factor.

People join local service clubs for various reasons, whether for business networking, making friends, fellowship, or learning about their community through thoughtful speakers. Still, surveys have shown that giving back to the community is the primary reason most people join a service club.

In 2021, the international parents of these organizations encouraged local clubs to collaborate to demonstrate this commitment to community service. This year the Rochester and Rochester Hills clubs gathered new clothing necessities (socks, underwear, and pajamas) for foster children. Chuck Bissell, President of the Rochester Kiwanis Club, said, "We are overwhelmed with the community response to this project!" The club took seven car loads of donated necessities to the Faith Communities Coalition on Foster Care (www.faithcommunitiescoalition.com), which serves the Detroit metro area.

Connie Shelton, President of the Rochester Lions, said, "Sometimes foster children are delivered to foster homes bringing nothing but the clothes on their backs. This drive provides them with some immediate necessities to help transition into their new temporary homes."

"Foster children experience great stress being separated from their birth families and friends, for whatever reason," said David Meyers, President of the Rochester Hills Lions Club. "The lack of clean underwear should not stress these children more."

"Through this project, we harnessed the power of these service organizations and local businesses, all of whom share a passion for taking action and creating lasting change," said Rotary President Tim Duncan. The Rochester Hills Public Library and Eugenia's 3rd Street Hair Gallery were extremely generous in allowing the public to drop off items. "We were happy to support this community project," said Kris Liegzeit, owner of Eugenia's.

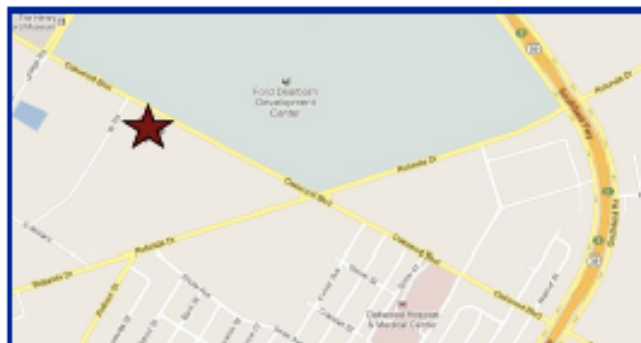
