  4. Encourage Involvement: Encourage new members to get involved in the club's activities, projects, and committees. This will give them hands-on experience and an opportunity to develop their leadership skills.
  5. Provide Opportunities for Growth: Offer new members leadership roles and opportunities to take on more responsibilities within the club. This will give them the chance to demonstrate their skills and gain experience.
  6. Recognize Achievements: Recognize and reward new members for their contributions and achievements. This will give them a sense of accomplishment and encourage them to continue to develop their skills and grow as leaders.

I also hope that you will be joining us at our District Convention in Mount Pleasant on March 31 through April 2. Grab your cowboy gear and come "Stampede" with Governor Shawn and this year's Cabinet as we take care of business, complete our service project, and have a great time!
