- Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in their single or sub-district.
- Secure the endorsement of their club or a majority of the clubs in their single district.
- Have served or will have served at the time they take office as first or second vice district governor:
- As officer of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof; and
- As a member of the district cabinet for a full term or major portion thereof.
- With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.
- Has not completed a full term or major portion thereof as district governor.



### Navigating Life After A Hurricane

GUIDE DOG CLIENT STORY - LION WALKER J. AND LEADER DOG LOKI

"Going to get vulnerable here for a moment. This morning, I had the most TERRIFYING experience of my life! My son,

Riley, had to return to school after two weeks of no school courtesy of the hurricane. Because of that, I was notified yesterday that his bus can only pick him up at the end of our street because of all the debris and power lines down. Which means he has to walk there. However, it's a very long road and I'm not going to let my son walk that far in the dark by himself at 6:00 a.m. So, I decided that I would go with him with Leader Dog Loki guiding me.

Loki and I have been practicing night walks for a while now, so I figured we could do this despite all the debris. As we began our walk to Riley's bus stop, things were fine at first—felt like any other night walk. But as we got further down the road, that's when things got scary. The amount of debris began to become worse and worse, and it got so bad that I could feel Loki pulling me to the middle of the road for long periods of time. This could only mean that there was a lot of stuff he was having to take me around. At this exact time, there were no more streetlights to give me any indication of where we were because they had fallen. So, while Loki could see, it was completely black for me. I was completely and totally blind. Finally, we reached the end of the street. I could hear Riley's bus and then I heard Riley yell "Bye, Dad, Love you!" So, I knew he got on the bus.

Now it was time to walk back, but this time on the other side of the road. This is when I lost it. We're walking and Loki is pulling me around even more stuff and I have no clue what it is. All I could think about is what if we get hurt? What if he makes a mistake and I get stabbed by a sharp branch or worse? I started hyperventilating and I couldn't stop. Loki's a fast walker, which didn't help my nerves either. As we continued forward, my heart was pounding out of my chest. All of a

sudden, I yelled out "Loki stop!" and I completely froze for about a minute. There we were, standing in the dark right there in the middle of the road, and I couldn't move. I had never been so scared in my entire life. Eventually I decided we couldn't stay there forever, so I knelt down and told Loki "I'm going to give you everything I have right now. We can do this. Take us home." So, we marched on. He's pulling me left and right. It felt like we were walking through an obstacle course. Not a single clue as what any of these obstacles were, but I trusted him with my whole heart and kept reminding myself that he can see things

that I can't. After what felt like an eternity, we finally

arrived at my doorstep. I broke down in tears. I fell down to the ground and held him and thanked him over and over again. I have never been so scared and so amazed in my life. I've seen Loki do the most amazing things, and I still couldn't believe he got me home. It's moments like this where I really see just how smart and well trained he is. It's moments like this where I really see his loyalty to me. It blows my mind. This dog doesn't owe me a damn thing. He didn't ask to be a guide dog. He didn't ask to be given to me. But this is what he is meant to do and he's damn good at it, despite some of our hiccups along the way. After seven months working alongside him, this was the most trust I've ever had to put into him and it paid off."



The LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME is a project of the Lions of Michigan Foundation. The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor those individuals who have had a significant impact on Lionism in Michigan and to preserve a memory and record of their service.

#### SELECTION

A maximum of seven individuals may be selected annually for enshrinement into the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame. The inductees shall include up to four living and two decessed individuals. Past International Directors will automatically be inducted at the end of their two year terms as International Director, and each year, one Hall of Fame inductee will be selected by a special committee consisting of the current members of the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame.

#### SELECTION COMMITTEE

The primary Hall of Fame Selection Committee will be comprised of the members of the Lions of Michigan Foundation's Fund Development and Marketing Committee.

#### NOMINATION

Nominations will be received annually, no later than March 1. All nominations must be made using the Nominating Forms provided by the Lions of Michigan Foundation. All portions of the Nomination Form must be completed in order for a nomination to be considered. A detailed Narrative for each Nomines should accompany the Nomination Form to provide the Selection Committee with additional information about the

Nominations may be initiated by an individual or individuals, a Lions Club or a District. Nominations must have the endorsement of the District Cabinet (one nomines per category) before they are submitted to the Foundation office. Individuals nominated and not selected, in any given year, may be nominated in a subsequent year through the endorsement of a current District Cabinet.

#### INDUCTEE

Inductees and their spouse/guest will be invited guests of the Lions of Michigan Foundation at their scheduled induction ceremony. The time and location of the induction ceremony will coincide with the Foundation's Acqui

#### 2025 Distinguished Service Award Application DISTRICT 11 A2 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

Service must include club & district level participation. MD & LCI level participation is NOT a requirement although can be a plus. (NOTE: This is intended as a District award for service at the District & Club level in this District.)

Must have served in a leadership role at the Club and District level.

Demonstrated service in support of one or more of the established District projects & programs.

Demonstrated service directly involving voluntary service to the Community.

Must currently be a District 11 A2 Lion in good standing as a full member with a minimum of seven years membership in the District at the time of the District Convention where this award is to be presented.

Nominee may NOT have been previous recipient of the Harold Pocklington Service Award. Nominee may NOT be currently serving as an International Director, District Governor or as a Vice District Governor.

Nominations must be submitted in writing to the Immediate Past District Governor not later than February 1, 2025 in proper format.

#### SELECTION PROCESS:

The Honorary Committee, chaired by the IPDG, shall consist of those PDG's who are active members of a District 11A2 Lions Club. The District Governor shall be a part of voting process but may not make a nomination.

Only one nomination by each member of the Honorary Committee, consisting of Past District Governors, may be submitted during a Lion's year.

Nominations shall be submitted, in writing, or by email to the most recent IPDG.

Following the selection, the IPDG shall be responsible to obtain the plaque and medallion. IPDG will also be responsible for having them engraved and shall present the award at the Annual District Convention Banquet. If the current IPDG is unable to do the presentation the next previous IPDG will do the presentation.

Information collected along with the medallions and engraving for plaques shall be shared with the next IPDG following the presentation of the Distinguished Service Award and the last meeting of the Honorary committee.

In order to secure complete nomination information, a PDG may need to contact the person being nominated. This information should remain confidential within the Honorary Committee.

In the event that a PDG is nominated for the Distinguished Service Award, the Chairperson of the Honorary Committee ,upon receipt of the completed nomination form, shall notify the nominated PDG. Thereafter, the nominated PDG shall not participate in the selection process during the Lion's year of the nomination.

#### VOTING PROCESS:

IPDG will call for a meeting of the Honorary Committee (consisting of active PDG's who have served for District 11A2) no less than 30 days prior to Annual District Convention. A quorum of the selection committee shall be no less than one third of the eligible members. If there is not a quorum or if no candidate receives the stated amount of votes, the award shall not be given in that year.

Voting shall be by written ballot or via telephone conference call, text message or email (if necessary). The recipient must receive one more than 50% of the ballots cast. If no nominee receives 1 more than 50% of the ballots cast, then the committee will take the top two (2) nominations and revote. Winner will be determined by who receives 50% plus one vote.

## LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME OFFICIAL NOMINATION FORM

The LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME is a project of the Lions of Michigan Foundation. The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor those individuals who have had a significant impact on Lionism in Michigan and to preserve a memory and record of their service.

#### SELECTION

A maximum of seven individuals may be selected annually for enshrinement into the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame. The inductees shall include up to four living and two deceased individuals. Past International Directors will automatically be inducted at the end of their two year term as International Director, and each year, one Hall of Fame inductee will be selected by a special committee consisting of the current members of the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame.

#### SELECTION COMMITTEE

The primary Hall of Fame Selection Committee will be comprised of the members of the Lions of Michigan Foundation's Fund Development and Marketing Committee.

#### NOMINATIONS

Nominations will be received annually, no later than March 1. All nominations must be made using the Nominating Forms provided by the Lions of Michigan Foundation. All portions of the Nomination Form must be completed in order for a nomination to be considered. A detailed Narrative for each Nominee should accompany the Nomination Form to provide the Selection Committee with additional information about the nominee. However, the Narrative shall have no numerical score.

Nominations may be initiated by an individual or individuals, a Lions Club or a District. Nominations must have the endorsement of the District Cabinet (one nominee per category) before they are submitted to the Foundation office. Individuals nominated and not selected, in any given year, may be nominated in a subsequent year through the endorsement of a current District Cabinet.

#### INDUCTEES

Inductees and their spouse/guest will be invited guests of the Lions of Michigan Foundation at their scheduled induction ceremony. The time and location of the induction ceremony will coincide with the Foundation's Annual Meeting.

#### RECORDS

The Lions of Michigan Foundation will be the official repository of records of the LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME. All records will be retained at the Lions of Michigan State Office.
